
### Step 1: Gather Documents and Information


#### Things you will need to fill out your FAFSA:

- Social Security Number
- Alien Registration Number (If you are not a U.S Citizen or COFA citizen)
- Your federal income tax returns, W-2s, and other records of money earned. (NOTE: You may be able to transfer your federal tax return information into your FAFSA using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool.)
- Bank statements and records of investment (if applicable)
- Records of untaxed income (if applicable)
- FSA ID




## Step 2: Create an FSA ID

- Go to http://fafsa.ed.gov
- Go to "Start Here"
- If you are new to FAFSA create an FSA ID.
- The student should use their UH email.
- The students parents should use their personal email.
  - Note: Both the student and a parent/guardian must make an FSA ID.
- NOTE: Make sure to write your username and password down after!!




### Step 3: Fill out FAFSA & Submit




- Choose which year your application is for.
- Fill out information accordingly.
- Link to IRS for tax documents to upload on its own.
- Make sure that you and your parent/guardian sign and submit your FAFSA.

### Step 4: Check for Updates

- Go to <a href="https://myuh.hawaii.edu">https://myuh.hawaii.edu</a>
  to check for updates made to
  your financial aid account.
- Click "View my financial aid information"
- Select "Award by Aid Year"





### Step 5: Submit Additional Documents

- Once your FAFSA is complete, our Financial Aid office may need additional documents.
- Some documents include:
  - FAFSA Verification Worksheet
  - Passport, Social Security Card, Proof of Employment, etc.
  - Ability to Benefit Worksheet
- In your UH email, you will receive an email if any documents are required for your application to be fully submitted.
- These documents will need to be turned in, or shown to our financial aid office.


